Class Size

The average class size is 18 students. Each class has a teacher’s aide.

Age Requirement

Children entering Kindergarten must be five-years-old by October 1 of the school year they enter Trinity. Also, all applicants for our Kindergarten program must successfully complete readiness testing.

Area of Curriculum	Skill or Activity
Bible	Old Testament overview. Scripture integration through all disciplines. Scripture memory.
Literature and Language Development	Letter recognition, letter/sound correspondence, rhyming, left-to-right activities, opposites, sequencing.
Writing	Letter/name/work writing, hand-eye coordination activities.
Mathematics	Numerals, number concepts, sorting, classifying, sequences and patterns, number words, counting, shapes.
Science	Exploration of natural world, seasons, observation, inquiry, experimentation, recording, verbalizing, prediction of outcomes.
Geography	Identify own country/state/town, introduce globe, other countries.
History	Special days, famous historical figures, family, introduces Biblical and world concepts.
Art	Experiencing media, patterning, hand-eye coordination, lives and works of artists.
Music	Lives and works of composers, singing, learning hymns, rhythm activities, movement exploration, listening skills.
Physical Activity	Large motor and skill development.
